CHILDREN'S DIRECTOR MISSION

Piñon Hills Community Church is the largest church in San Juan County. Piñon Hills Kids Ministry has been exploding with new and young families with infants through 5th grade.

PHCC is looking for a Children's Director to oversee the development of the overall Kid's Ministry inclusive of staff, interns, leaders, volunteers, parents, and of course, the kids.

The Children's Director will be tasked with finding or creating curriculum utilized on Sundays in each age-specific area. Because we see hundreds of kids in our ministry each month, this role is less about spending time with individual children and more about building teams and systems that allow a personal touch for the kids and parents.

The Children's Direction is not an isolated or siloed ministry. PHCC places a high value in connecting families and children and introducing them to Jesus, so there is a high amount of collaboration and team effort to help this person succeed in their role.

That being said, we are looking for a self-motivated and passionate driver in this position who can take our pre-existing systems and improve them, renovate them, and continue to push forward by thinking outside of the box in fresh and creative ways.

- Lead a Christ-centered, relational, discipleship-oriented Sunday morning experience designed specifically for children
- Invest, lead and equip parents of children to help them "win" by being the best leaders of their children they can be

- Lead a core team of parents and other adult leaders in growing a highly credible, accountable and relational ministry
- Provide family ministry through serving and training children
- Develop effective/efficient ministry infrastructure and systems
- Prepare rooms, resources and leadership for volunteers
- Maintain active communication through multimedia, social media, email, text, signage and services
- Provide seasonal programming for holidays and special events
- Develop programming for children's summer activities
- Attend staff meetings as prescribed and function as a member of the PHCC staff

PINON HILLS COMMUNITY CHURCH

Pastor John Morgan came to Piñon Hills Community Church in 1995 from Denver, Colorado. In those days, the church was The Exciting Tabernacle Baptist Church. John's vision was to lead Piñon Hills to become a spiritually dynamic, regional church based on an attractive and functional ministry campus. PHCC began a new era of growth and almost every year the former campus on Butler Avenue was remodeled and the service schedules changed to support the growth.

In 1997, PHCC acquired the first half of the 60-acre property, where the church is now located on Piñon Hills Boulevard. In 1999 the church voted to re-

incorporate as a non-denominational, evangelical church named Piñon Hills Community Church. The second half of the new ministry campus property was acquired in 2007. PHCC built and entered the first phase of its new ministry campus on Piñon Hills Boulevard in the fall of 2010. It built the Student Center in 2013.

PHCC strives to impact the Four Corners region by REACHING people who need Christ, GROWING people in Christ and then SERVING people through Christ. Our vision is to incite a revolution of Christian leadership.

In 2018, Pastor Matt Mizell replaced Pastor John as the new Lead Pastor of PHCC. While much of the same vision still exists, PHCC is experiencing a revitalization with a recent influx of young families.

FARMINGTON, NM

Farmington is in San Juan County located at the junction of three rivers that run through New Mexico. It is the largest city in the county, and the county is one of the geographically largest counties in the United States, covering more than 5,000 square miles. Farmington is also on the Trails of the Ancient Byway, one of the designated New Mexico Scenic Byways.

Farmington is known across the state for a great baseball program, being one of the major cities of New Mexico to host baseball tournaments. Farmington High School has claimed the AAAA Baseball State Championship 4 years in a row. Farmington has been the home of the Connie Mack World Series baseball tournament, played in August every year at Ricketts Park (capacity 5,072), for 50 years. Connie Mack league regular season play includes players age 16 to 18. The Connie Mack World Series consists of 10 or more teams from various regions around the United States, including Puerto Rico. In 2019, PHCC will be kicking off the Connie Mack series by hosting a community-wide church service for the first time.

The Farmington Municipal School District serves more than 10,000 students at 18 schools, including three high schools. There is also a great private school system, with 6 private schools operating in the area. San Juan College is a public two-year college that is building out dorms scheduled to open in 2020.

The primary industries of San Juan County are the production of petroleum, natural gas, and coal. Major coalmines operated by BHP Billiton make up a majority of the employment opportunities in Farmington.

Farmington is known as the place where outdoor lovers live and families thrive, and that's because it is a great place to be outdoors and enjoy all the state of

New Mexico has to offer—abundant, wide open land, space to breathe and explore, and beautiful vistas to take in.

Popular outdoor activities include world-class fly fishing, camping, hunting, mountain biking, boating, jet skiing, hiking, ATV and Jeep exploration, skiing and snowboarding. In 2017, the City of Farmington opened a sandy beach at Farmington Lake with floating water inflatables that attract families young and old. The Navajo Lake Marina was rated in 2018 as the #1 inland marina in the United States, which was recently overhauled in a multi-million-dollar renovation so it now includes outdoor eating areas and restaurants, a splash pad, bumper boats, and boat rentals. A new waterpark is currently under construction approximately 5 minutes from PHCC. Farmington has one of the highest ratios of parks per capita in the entire state with a total of 63 public parks.

Piñon Hills Community Church is located in a high desert, western, outdoors-oriented and natural-resources-based culture with heavy influences from the Navajo Indian Community and other Tribes, the Hispanic Community, the Anglo Community and others, the oil and gas industry, and the power plant industry. PHCC is one of the largest evangelical ministries that reaches Navajos and other Native Americans in the U.S.

Metro Farmington is 41,000 in size and the county is 100,000+ in size. The town serves a retail population of 250,000 who commute to Farmington from places like the Navajo Reservation and Durango, Colorado. It has the retail stores (such as Walmart, Target & Dillard's), restaurants (such as Chick-Fil-A, Chipotle & Olive Garden), and services that are typical of a town that is twice its size or more. Farmington is a 45-minute drive to Durango, Colorado, a 90-minute drive to Durango Mountain & Wolf Creek Ski Areas, a 90-minute drive to Pagosa Springs, Colorado, a 3-hour drive to Albuquerque, and a 7-hour drive to Denver, Phoenix, Las Vegas or El Paso.
